I'll never forget that moment. It speaks to a larger truth. Towns like mine are forgotten.

More and more young people are heading for our big cities, leaving small towns and never coming back. But I don't want to add to that movement. ___55___. Now it's my turn to help people younger than me. And you know what? I'm a sixth grade teacher in Helena now.
